Museum of Science Boston, Massachusetts



Under direction of the late Dr. Roger L. Nichols, the Boston Museum of Science achieved major growth in attendance and facilities over the period 1985-1988. During this time, White Oak's John Jacobsen was associate director of the Museum, in charge of the theaters and marketing division as well as executive producer of the \$24 million wing and Mugar Omni Theater, which opened in 1987 with great success. Attendance grew from a former plateau of 950,000 to a peak of 2,200,000 in 1988, a figure that has not been equaled or exceeded since. Jacobsen worked very closely with Dr. Nichols, not only at the Museum, but also in the formation of several intermuseum networks, most notably the *Museum Film Network*, dedicated to producing giant screen films, such as *To the Limit*, for which Mr. Jacobsen organized the financing.
