

National Coast Guard Museum

New London, CT

In 2007/2008, the United States Coast Guard, responding to a congressional mandate, undertook a national RFP competition for a strategic master plan, selecting White Oak to develop the *Strategic Master Plan* for a National Coast Guard Museum in New London, CT. White Oak completed the *Plan* in 2008 based on a site at Fort Trumbull that became unavailable. In April 2013, the City of New London proposed a new downtown waterfront site to the Coast Guard and the National Coast Guard Museum Association for the new museum.

To undertake this update to the 2008 *Plan*, the USCG again commissioned White Oak to prepare an *Addendum to the Strategic Master Plan* reflecting the construction site changes, as well as updates to the architectural program based on a new Concept Design with its different museum components, parking assumptions, and capital budget.

White Oak is proud to have facilitated the planning process to establish a National Coast Guard Museum - honoring the Coast Guard's two centuries of history - in the newly proposed site in New London.

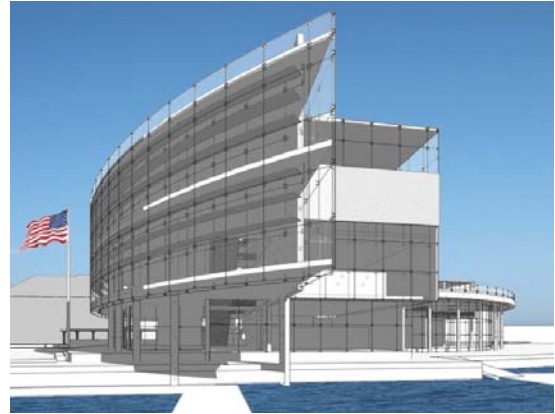
